

Interprofessional Education

Background

Interprofessional education (IPE) is a learning approach to prepare students from different health professions, including doctors, pharmacists, nurses, midwives, physiotherapists, and clinical psychologists, to provide patient care in a collaborative team environment to improve the overall quality of healthcare services (Buring, et al., 2009). The implementation of IPE will affect positive attitudes towards other professions and can improve knowledge and skills of collaboration compared to the conventional implementation, in which each profession conducts its own education. In addition, IPE can increase students' readiness to collaborate when practicing healthcare in the future, thereby removing cultural barriers and poor communication between professions which remain to exist to date. Good collaboration between health professionals is expected to optimize services and the overall health of the patients (Marcussen, et al., 2019). Therefore, it is necessary to provide an education system for prospective health workers through IPE to prepare them for future collaborative practice in health facilities. Taking into account the needs and benefits of the primacy of IPE, the Department of Pharmacy organizes a workshop on "Interprofessional Education and Collaborative Practice in Health Care" to provide an alternative learning system in Higher Education in Health to develop the collaborative competencies of prospective health workers.
